Badge Appointment Scheduling

Anyone needing an airport badge should <u>schedule an appointment</u> by calling (509) 576-6383. Airport ID Badges must be obtained prior to gaining unescorted access to the airport. Allow at least 7-14 days for processing. Anyone needing fingerprints for a Security Identification Display Area (SIDA) badge will need to schedule a separate appointment. Please allow up to 3 weeks for SIDA badge processing and Transportation Security Administration (TSA) required training prior to unescorted access to the SIDA.

What to Bring to the Operations and Security Office:

- 1. Please complete the following application.
 - a. The applicant should complete section 1.
 - b. Read Section 3 carefully, then sign, and date. Failure to comply with airport security regulations can result in the revocation of all access privileges.
- 2 Bring the completed application to the Operations and Security Office. Only original applications will be accepted. It is also recommended that you keep a copy for your own records.
- 3. Bring photo identification to your badge appointment to verify identity. (An unexpired Airport Badge or Driver's License meet this requirement.)
- 4. Applicants who are Non-US Citizens must bring documentation verifying identity and work authorization and the airport ID must expire no later than the expiration date of the work authorization.
- 5. If there are questions regarding safe operations on the airport, or security regulations, we will be happy to answer them during your appointment. You may also contact the security office at 576-6383.

The following fees will be charged for obtaining an Airport Issued Identification Badge (fees subject to change at any time). All badge application fees must be paid prior to badge issuance. The fingerprint fee must be paid at the time of application.

AREA OPERATIONS YAKIMA AIR TERMINAL - McALLISTER FIELD SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION - PEDESTRIAN AND SERVICE VEHICLE REGULATIONS.

Procedures for PEDESTRIANS on the RUNWAY or in the RUNWAY SAFETY AREA.

Definition:

Movement Areas and Safety Areas are defined as Runways, Taxiways and the associated Safety Areas. Tower clearance is REQUIRED prior to crossing a solid yellow and dashed yellow line marked on the ramp(s).

Authorization:

- 1) The following personnel are authorized to be on foot in the movement and safety areas of the airport:
 - a) Airport Maintenance and Management personnel.
 - b) FAA Maintenance personnel.
 - c) ARFF personnel.
 - d) Construction personnel working under a pre-approved Construction Safety Plan.
- 2) Pedestrians in the movement area must be in contact with the Yakima Air Traffic Control Tower.
- 3) Pedestrians must use the same radio procedures as vehicle operators.

Procedures for SERVICE VEHICLES operating on the RUNWAY.

Fuel Truck Operations on the Runways:

Fuel Trucks are not authorized on, or to cross, runways. Fuel Trucks needing access to the opposite side of the airport must use the fuel service road on the east side of the airport. If a fuel truck has a need to cross or operate on the runway, an escort must be arranged through Yakima Airport, or YKM ARFF.

Aircraft Support Vehicles (including Towing Vehicles):

Aircraft tows are not authorized to cross, or operate on, runways. Aircraft tows that need to cross or operate on the runway must be escorted by Yakima Airport, or YKM ARFF personnel. Aircraft towing on taxiways is permitted at any time, provided clearance has been received from YKM Air Traffic Control Tower.

Sanctions of Non-Compliance:

Failure to follow these procedures will result in: First offense, retraining; Second offense, written warning; Third offense, revocation of airfield access. Note: Depending upon the severity of the non-compliant action, any or all of the above sanctions may be enforced.




